





Recent Updates

<input type="checkbox"/>	The World Health Organization has declared the current COVID-19 outbreak a pandemic, 11 March
<input type="checkbox"/>	As of 11 March 2020, the minister of health, Dr Mkhize, has confirmed 13 cases of SARS-CoV 2 in South Africa. All cases have a recent travel history to a country experiencing local transmission of SARS-CoV 2.
<input type="checkbox"/>	The National Institute for Communicable Disease, in collaboration with the National Institute for Occupational Health and the National Department of Health, hosted a webinar entitled <i>What EMS need to know about coronavirus</i> , 11 March.

<input type="checkbox"/>	COVID-19 has killed 168 more people in Italy in the past 24 hours, the highest toll in a single day since the start of the outbreak. To date Italy has 10 149 with 631 reported deaths.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Patient who 'absconded' Zimbabwe hospital tested negative for SARS-CoV2. The 26-year-old man left the hospital before he could be tested for SARS-CoV2 turned himself in for the test on 10 March. Zimbabwe has no confirmed cases of coronavirus.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Iran reported on 10 March that 54 people had died after contracting coronavirus in the past 24 hours, the highest single-day toll since the start of the outbreak in February. Iran has now confirmed 9 000 cases and 354 deaths.
<input type="checkbox"/>	South Korea reported an increase in new coronavirus cases on 11 March as authorities tested hundreds of staff at a call center where the disease appeared this week, reversing 11 days of slowing infections. The total number of confirmed cases in the country is 7 775 with 54 deaths.
<input type="checkbox"/>	On the Africa continent, 10 countries have tests positive for SARS-CoV 2 thus far; Egypt (55), Algeria (20), Morocco (2), Tunisia (5), Nigeria (2), Senegal (4), Togo (1), Burkina Faso (2), South Africa (7).
<input type="checkbox"/>	5 new countries/territories/areas (Brunei Darussalam, Mongolia, Cyprus, Guernsey and Panama) have reported cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours.
<input type="checkbox"/>	109 countries have reported at least one Covid-19 case with 62 countries with local transmission.

Port Health Screening Updates

- 1366 travelers from high risk area arrived in the 24 hour period for 10 March.
- Total number of conveyances from high risk ports of origin for 10 March was reported as 19; eight of these were monitored and cleared by Port Health Officials.
- Eleven international flights at OR Tambo International Airport’s were received and all passengers were screened in the respective bridges prior to reaching the terminal.
