Treatment

<b>Feces</b> Contaminated food or water	<ul><li>Vaccine</li><li>Practice good hygiene</li></ul>	No specific medication available Treated through supportive care (rest, adequate nutrition, and fluids) to help relieve symptoms
Through contact with the blood or bodily fluids of an infected person	<ul> <li>Vaccine</li> <li>Practice safe sex</li> <li>Blood screening</li> </ul>	Combination antiviral therapies (with Tenofovir or Tenofovir derivatives plus lamivudine)
Blood-to-blood contact	<ul> <li>Practice safe sex</li> <li>Avoid sharing needles, toothbrushes, razors or nail scissors</li> </ul>	Combination therapies with direct acting antivirals (DAAs)
Contact with infected blood (only occurs in people already infected with hepatitis B)	<ul> <li>Hepatitis B vaccine</li> <li>Avoid sharing needles, toothbrushes, razors or nail scissors</li> </ul>	Interferon
<b>Feces</b> Contaminated food or water	<ul> <li>Practice Good Hygiene</li> <li>Avoid drinking water that has come from a potentially unsafe source</li> <li>Cook food well</li> </ul>	No specific medication available Supportive Care
