# GUIDANCE FOR THE LABORATORY INVESTIGATION OF SUSPECTED CASES OF MPOX SUBMITTED FROM LABORATORIES OUTSIDE OF SOUTH AFRICA

### STEP 1: CONTACT THE NICD FOR ACCESS TO IMPORT PERMIT

#### STEP 2: COMPLETE THE CASE INVESTIGATION FORM

Fully complete the case investigation form

#### STEP 3: SUBMIT SPECIMENS FOR SPECIALIZED LABORATORY INVESTIGATION

• The following specimens are used for the investigation:

Specimen type	Collection materials	Comments
Skin lesion material: Swabs of lesion/s* Lesion roof/s, and/or lesion crust/s Aspirates of lesion fluid (not recommended, but may be submitted)	Swabs (for example dacron or polyester flocked swabs) can be submitted dry (in capped tube) or in viral transport media.  Preferably, avoid "culture swabs"	
*collect specimen by vigorously rubbing the swab over the lesion surface (without causing injury)	which is transported in Amies transport media.	

Any other specimen type to be discussed with the laboratory before submission (see contact details below), and may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

 The specimens for diagnostic investigation should be packaged in accordance with the guidelines for the transport of dangerous biological goods in accordance with <u>UN3373 Biological substances/Category B</u> <u>shipping instructions</u> (IATA packaging instruction 650) <u>directly and urgently</u> to:

- Ensure that completed case investigation form accompanies the specimens;
- Samples should be kept cold during transport (cold packs are sufficient, no dry ice required).
